

Internship Opportunities at South East Universities in 2010

<p>Buckinghamshire New University</p>	<p>Buckinghamshire New University will offer 40 graduate internships. These will be arranged mainly for small businesses and larger companies in the digital industry sector. A wage subsidy of £1,200 will be available for a 12 week internship.</p>
<p>Canterbury Christ Church University</p>	<p>Canterbury Christ Church University (CCCU) will deliver 35 graduate internships with small businesses. The internship is for a maximum period of three months. £1,500 will be available to support the intern. A CV Matching service will ensure that there is mutual benefit for graduate and employer.</p>
<p>Oxford Brookes University</p>	<p>Oxford Brookes will deliver 60 graduate internships. These will cover all 7 sectors and are principally for small businesses in the Oxfordshire area. Approximately £1,000 will be available to the employer as a wage subsidy. Oxford Brookes will offer the employer an intern for a minimum period of 3 months.</p>
<p>Southampton Solent University</p>	<p>Three universities - the University of Southampton, University of Winchester and Southampton Solent University will deliver 80 graduate internships. These will be arranged across all sectors and targeted at small, medium and large sized companies. The internship must be between 10 to 13 weeks. Interested companies need to be based in Hampshire. £1,350 will be available to support the intern.</p>
<p>University for the Creative Arts</p>	<p>UCA will delivery 75 graduate internships in the region. These will be arranged mainly in the digital industry sector and especially in the small businesses. UCA will work with its industry partners and networks to identify potential host companies. Each company will be offered an opportunity to attend a mentoring workshop. Companies will be asked to provide the graduates with some mentoring support to ensure longer term impact. Companies will be selected according to a set of criteria: quality of project to be undertaken; health & safety policy; indemnity insurance in place; commitment to staff development; sector fit (digital); potential employment prospects for graduates.</p>
<p>University of Brighton</p>	<p>The University of Brighton will offer 35 graduate internships. The internship consists of a six week full-time placement and integrated employability programme with an appropriate wage subsidy available. The scheme covers all sectors, bar digital industries, and is mainly applicable to small businesses but also medium and large companies in the local area, where appropriate.</p>

University of Kent	The University of Kent will deliver 100 graduate internships. The internship is for a maximum period of 3 months. The internship will mainly cover the digital industry sector, life science and pharmaceutical, professional and financial services. The scheme is available to small companies, except in the life science and pharmaceutical sector. Bursaries of £500 per month will be available to support a 3 month internship
University of Portsmouth	The University of Portsmouth will deliver 90 graduate internships. These will be arranged in all sectors and targeted at small, medium and large sized companies. The internships should be a minimum of 13 weeks. £1,200 will be available as a wage subsidy.
University of Reading	The University of Reading will deliver 45 graduate internships through its GradSEED programme. £1,000 will be available to the employer for a job subsidy, on a 13 week internship. These will be especially targeted at small businesses in Oxfordshire and Berkshire in any sector interested in employing a graduate. Businesses will be able to access CVs and shortlist the most appropriate candidates and all recruitment advertising costs for the internships will be covered by the scheme.
University of Sussex	The University of Sussex in partnership with Wired Sussex will deliver 175 graduate internships. The internship will provide a 20 day (minimum) graduate-level placement within any small to medium companies in the Sussex Counties. For companies with more than 30 employees, the programme is offered within the following sectors: digital, design, environmental, life science and pharmaceutical, advanced engineering and manufacturing, professional and financial services. The placement can support any aspect of the business and employers will pay the graduate at the minimum wage. Commitment from companies who are interested in participating is sought by March 12th 2010.
